"The design is already out there," she says. "Just picking up a piece of wood or rock from the ground. I can come up with an entire line of jewelry." The California jeweler has lived in Carmel and Mendocino, two places lauded for their natural beauty, and now spends time hiking—and sourcing material—for Santa Monica Beach. Graham's nature-inspired steel and 18-karat gold collection from \$300 for individual stack rings to about \$7,000 for a large necklace is available at boutiques such as Kasier and Kind in Los Angeles and Fragments in New York. Up next is a men's jewelry line. "The steel is a perfect fit for guys," says Graham. "I'd also like to get my husband to wear pearls, but that will be more of a challenge." —EM
